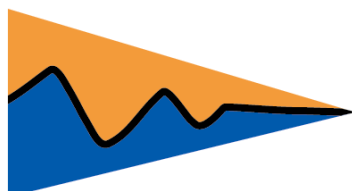


2010 Wabamun Open Regatta & 2010 Western Canadian Laser Masters Championships

June 5-6, 2010

Wabamun Sailing Club
Lake Wabamun, Alberta



NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

The Wabamun Open is open to all dinghy and catamaran classes. Eligible competitors may enter by completing the online registration on the Wabamun Sailing Club web site and by bringing the signed registration form to the onsite registration office.

Competitors who register and pay by May 16nd, 2010 will receive a \$10 discount. To receive this discount, the registration form and payment must be postmarked no later than May 16nd, 2010 or the online registration process and payment must be completed by May 16nd, 2010.

3. FLEETS

5 or more boats of the same class registered by 09:00 hours on Saturday June 5th will constitute a class. All other boats will sail in the open class and their times will be adjusted using the current wind adjusted Portsmouth ratings. There will be a single standard Laser start but the results for the Western Canadian Masters Championships will be extracted from the overall results and recalculated.

4. FEES

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available upon completion of registration at the Wabamun Sailing Club.

6. VENUE

The Wabamun Sailing Club is located 60 km west of Edmonton on Lake Wabamun.

7. SCHEDULE

Registration	June 4th	20:00 – 21:00
Registration	June 5th	08:00 – 09:00

Warning Signal for first race of the day	June 5th	10:00
Warning Signal for first race of the day	June 6th	09:00

The last race on June 6th, 2010 will not start later than 15:00 hours.

8. AMENDMENTS

Any amendments to this Notice of Race will be posted here no later than May 14th, 2010.

9. COURSES

The diagrams in diagram 1 show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

10. SCORING

Seven races are scheduled of which one race must be completed to constitute a series.

(a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When from 5 to 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

The North American Laser Masters' age adjusted scoring system will be used to determine the Western Canadian Laser Masters Championships.

11. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

12. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

13. PRIZES

Trophies will be awarded based on the following numbers of boats per fleet or Laser Masters age division:

- 2-5 boats 1st place
- 6-9 boats 1st & 2nd places
- 10 or more boats 1st, 2nd & 3rd places

14. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

15. INSURANCE

Each participant is responsible to ensure that he/she is covered by valid liability insurance.

16. RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

In participating in the event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

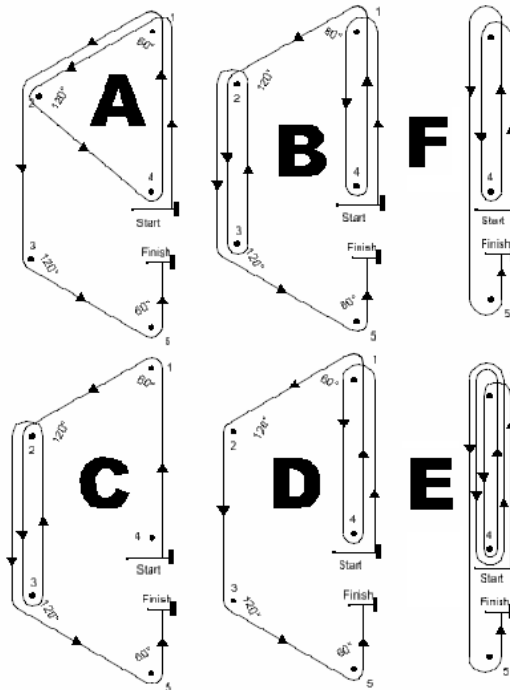

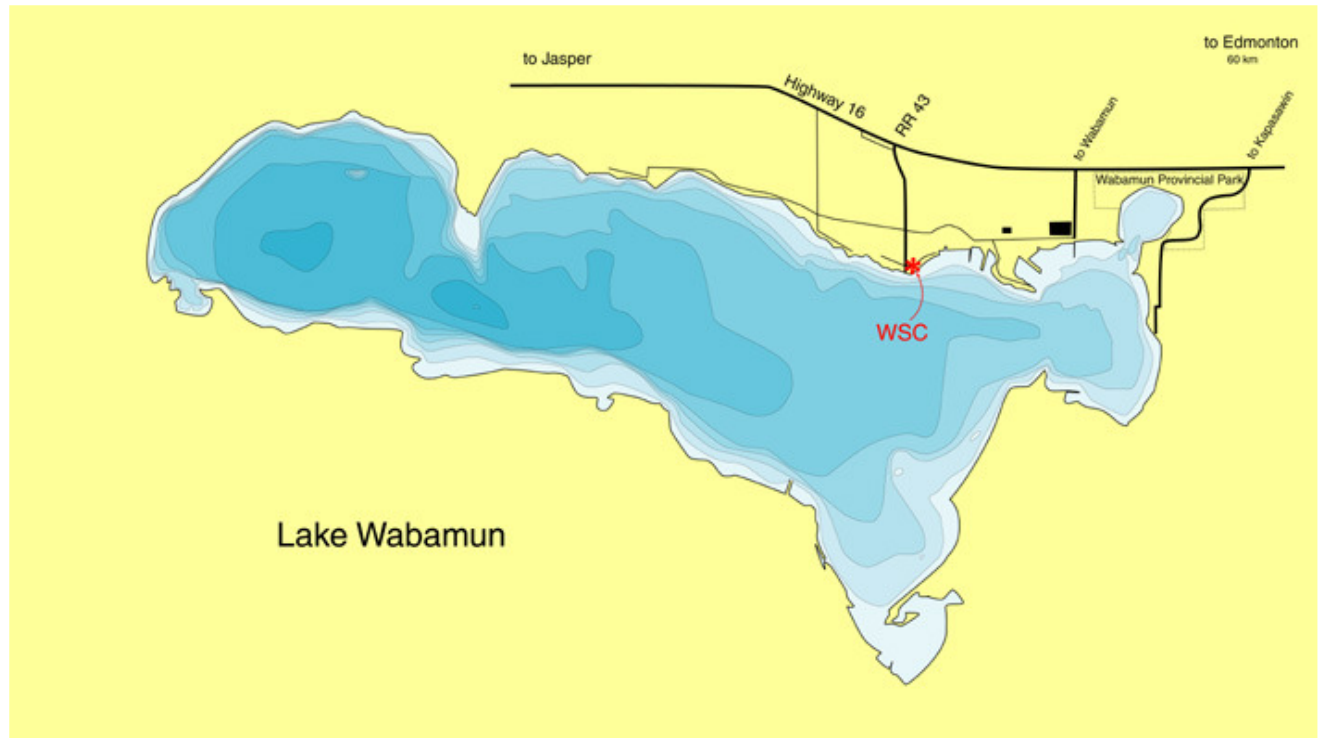
